Y., June 25—St. Mary's Protestant Episcopal Church was the setting here this afternoon for the marriage of Miss Anne Perkins, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George Walbridge Perkins of 6 East Ninety-fourth Street, New York, and Glynwood Farm, Cold Spring, to Francis Higginson Cabot Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. Cabot of Green Plains, North, Va.

The ceremony was performed by the Rev. Cornelius P. Trowbridge, rector of St. Peter's Church, Morristown, N. J., who was assisted by the Rev. Frederick Q. Shafer, rector of St. Mary's. A reception was held at Glynwood Farm.

Given in marriage by her father, the bride wore a gown of ivory satin, made with a basque bodice, finished with a net yoke, long sleeves and bouffant skirt. Her veil of rare Bruxelles lace was arranged in cap fashion, and she carried a bouquet of white butterfly orchids and stephanotis.

Mrs. William B. Wilson of Garrison, N. Y., was her sister's matron of honor. The other attendants were Mrs. Walter F. Chappell 3d of New York and the Misses Gertrude Perkins of Gates Mills, Ohio; Joan Kurtz and Gaior Ingersoll of Philadelphia, Jean Rennard of Westbury, L. I., and Adelaide C. A. Mrs. Cabot is a granddaughter of Mrs. George W. Perkins of Riverdale, N. Y., and Cold Spring, and the late Mr. Perkins, one-time partner in J. P. Morgan & Co. and friend of the late President Theodore Roosevelt, who served as chairman of the Interstate Palisades Park Commission.

She is a granddaughter also of the late George Merck, founder of the chemical manufacturing firm of Merck & Co. in Rahway, N. J., and the late Mrs. Merck of Llewellyn Park, West Orange, N. J.
