Petition of Michael Green of the

Humble Petitioner

That the late Timothy Donahue
in his life time of the City of Quebec, Celler
and Sarah Linn his Wife, both
departed this life at the said City of
Quebec, to wit, the said late Sarah
Linn on the fifteenth July one thousand
eight hundred and thirty four and
the said Timothy Donahue on the fifth
January one thousand eight hundred
and thirty five, leaving after them
six minor children issue of their
lawful Marriage who are now living
namely, Ellen aged eighteen years,
Julia aged sixteen years, Mary
aged twelve years, John aged ~~ten~~
years, and Thomas aged six years.
That no Tutor or Subtutor has
been appointed to the said minor
Children since the death of their
said Father and that it is necessary
to the interests of the said Minors
that they should have a Tutor
