Mr. and Mrs. Henry W. de Forest of 63 East Seventy-ninth Street and Nethermuir, Cold Spring Harbor, L. I., have announced the engagement of their younger daughter, Miss Alice de Forest, to Francis Minturn Sedgwick, son of Henry Dwight Sedgwick, author, and the late Mrs. Sedgwick. The engagement is of wide interest in this city and also in Stockbridge, where for generations the Sedgwick family has been prominent.

Miss de Forest is a granddaughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Henry Grant de Forest and, on the maternal side, of Mrs. Charles Phelps Noyes and the late Mr. Noyes. She is a niece of Robert W. de Forest, President of the Metropolitan Museum of Art, and is the sister of Mrs. Beverley Duer, the former Miss Julia Mary de Forest, and of Charles Noyes de Forest. She was graduated from Miss Nightingale's School and was introduced to society last season. Her father is a well-known lawyer.

Mr. Sedgwick is a grandson of the late Mr. and Mrs. Henry Dwight Sedgwick of Stockbridge and a nephew of Ellery Sedgwick of Boston. On the maternal side he is a grandson of the late Mr. and Mrs. Robert B. Minturn, who for many years lived in the Gramercy Park section. He was graduated from Harvard University with the class of '26 and is a member of the Porcellian Club. He was a student for a year at Trinity College, Cambridge, England, and for the last eighteen months has been studying the banking business in Europe.
